Cancer is not one but many diseases. How it develops and its symptoms, diagnosis and treatment vary widely based on cancer type and where it is located in the body. Cancer refers to cells growing out of control. It can occur almost anywhere in the body. Solid tumors are malignant growths, or masses, that develop in the body's organs and tissues. According to the National Cancer Institute, in 2020, more than 1.8 million people will be diagnosed with cancer and more than 600,000 people will die of cancer in the United States. Cancer has traditionally been treated with a combination of surgery, chemotherapy and radiation therapy. If a cancer is caught early enough, it can sometimes be completely removed,

Learning that you've been diagnosed with cancer can be overwhelming—and terrifying. You may dread side effects of treatment, worry about survival and feel anxiety about how your life may be upended, all while trying to process a lot of new information and make important decisions about your care. The more you learn about your cancer and your treatment options and find support, the more you'll feel in charge of your care.
