## Pastor's Corner-



## National Colon Cancer Awareness Month



Most colon cancers develop first as polyps, which are abnormal growths inside the colon or rectum that may later become cancerous if not removed. The American Cancer Society estimates that 147,950 people will be diagnosed with colon cancer and 53,200 could die from this disease in 2020.

Colon cancer is the third most common cancer in the US, and the second leading cause of cancer death. It affects men and women of all racial and ethnic groups, and is most often found in people 50 years or older. Your family history, ethnicity and race can put you at a higher risk for colorectal cancer. Incidence and mortality rates are highest in African Americans.

Regular screening, beginning at age 50, is the key to preventing colon cancer. However incidence in those younger than 50 is on the rise. This disease takes the lives of more than 50,000 people every year; help bring awareness and learn how to prevent this disease and lower that statistic.
