National Autism Awareness Month



Autism is a complex, lifelong developmental disability that typically appears during early childhood and can impact a person's social skills, communication, relationships, and self-regulation. It is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a "spectrum condition" affecting people differently and to varying degrees.

Currently, 1 in 59 children are diagnosed with Autism. Early signs can include: Speaking later than typical or not at all (nonverbal); repetition in language or movement, such as repeating the same word or sounds, hand flapping, or any repeated movement ; Atypical nonverbal communication, including avoiding eye contact, giving few facial expressions, or having a monotone speech.

Boys are four times more likely to be diagnosed with autism than girls. Most children were still being diagnosed after age 4, though autism can be reliably diagnosed as early as age 2. Autism affects all ethnic and socioeconomic groups however minority groups tend to be diagnosed later and less often. There is no medical detection for autism, and there is no known single cause. Early diagnosis helps a person receive the support and services that they need, which can lead to an improved quality of life.
